6) News from the field

Insight into the genome's dark matter (GSCN) 19.11.2019

Expansions of DNA repeats can lead to diseases but are very hard to analyze. A method developed by researchers at the Max Planck Institute for Molecular Genetics in Berlin allows for a detailed look at these previously inaccessible regions of the genome. It combines nanopore sequencing, stem cell, and CRISPR-Cas technologies. The method could improve the diagnosis of various congenital diseases and cancers in the future and has been published in *Nature Biotechnology*. (press text)
