2) GSCN travel awards - deadline is 31 May

If you would like to apply for a travel award for a stem cell research conference in the time from 1 July till 30 Sept., you should do it soon – deadline for the applications is 31 May.

GSCN members and scientists in Germany can apply for travel awards to international stem cell conferences, workshops, and events. To apply please send the submitted abstract to the event and a short letter of motivation (max. 1 page) to the GSCN Office (gscn.office@mdc-berlin.de). The letter should contain 1) the importance of the event for the applicant, 2) how the applicant profits from the event and 3) why financial support is important.

The travel award winner receives 500 € for a European conference and 1000 € for a conference oversea.

Attention: For the GSCN conference the travel awardee gets 400 € plus the registration fee – but the deadline is 19 June.
