1) Great GSCN Conference in Heidelberg

The Annual GSCN Conference 2018 welcomed more than 400 participants, offered three joining symposia and attracted 28 companies to the German Cancer Research Center (DKFZ) in Heidelberg from 19 - 21 September 2018

The online follow-up survey gave a very positive feedback, best summarized in the following anonymous quotes: "Networking is great and clearly in the heart of the conference. 2) GSCN White Paper on Translation published

A GSCN working group has written a White Paper "Translation – von der Stammzelle zur innovativen Therapie. Analyse und Empfehlungen zur klinischen Translation von Stammzellforschung in Deutschland". Interviews with national and international stem cell researchers about translational gaps and hurdles were made and analyzed and resulting recommendations extracted. 7) News from the field August till October 2018

Looking for the perfect blood (DE) (GSCN)

20.08.2018

The demand for blood reserves is constantly growing, and the supply is shrinking at the same time. Experts warn of bottlenecks in medical care. Researchers are also working on artificial blood that is to be produced entirely in the laboratory. This could be achieved with the help of stem cells. (press text)

Myocardial infarction: First beating heart muscle cells produced from stem cells (DE) (GSCN) 05.09.2018

In a heart attack, part of the heart muscle tissue dies irreversibly - the heart remains damaged, even if the heart attack is survived. Current biomedical research focuses on the therapeutic replacement of these dead heart muscle cells. Now, for the first time, Würzburg researchers have succeeded in producing beating heart muscle cells from special stem cells. (press text)

Milestone for the stem cell network in NRW: Ministry of Science holds out the prospect of long-term funding (DE) (GSCN)

05.09.2018

The established Competence Network Stem Cell Research NRW is to be permanently funded by the state starting in 2019. To this end, 19 universities, university clinics and non-university research institutions located in NRW have today jointly founded the association "Stammzellnetzwerk.NRW".
