1) Candidates for GSCN Scientific Awards

The GSCN will select in 2016 outstanding researchers and publications in three award categories. Please enter your candidates at the links until 31 March 2016:

Young Investigator (German-based) (The candidate should be within 8 year after the doctorate degree and in her/his first faculty/independent position (non-tenured); GSCN membership is not required)

Publication of the Year (July 2015 - June 2016)

The third award "Publication of the Year" will be selected in July 2016 based on the publications from July 2015 - June 2016 (the first author will be presenting). If you like to have a publication considered for the "Publication of the Year" Award, please send the pdf to the GSCN office (gscn.office@mdc-berlin.de). You can also include a brief statement why the paper is an important contribution to the field of stem cell research.

All awardees will give a presentation in the presidential session at the GSCN conference on 13 September, 2016 in Hannover. Each award also includes an amount of 1,500 €. Candidates will be evaluated by the awards committee.

More than 1000 students will gather for the first UniStem Day in Germany on 11 March in 8 cities. The aim: a completely educational day for high school students only about stem cell research. With lectures, games, laboratory tours and hands-on experiments. Germany takes part for the first time in the UniStem Day in Europe – in eight countries more than 27,000 students will pay attention to stem cell research and applied fields. 
